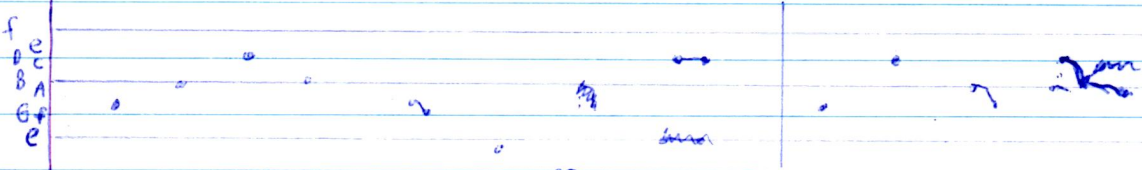

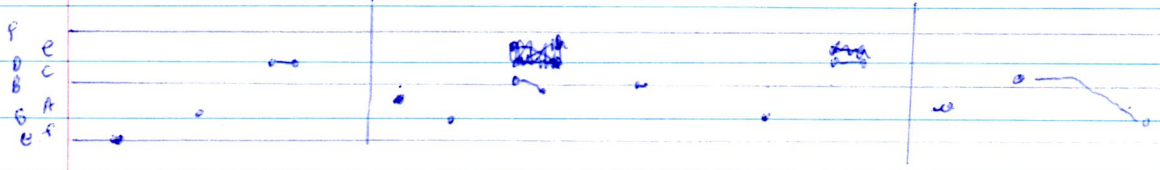

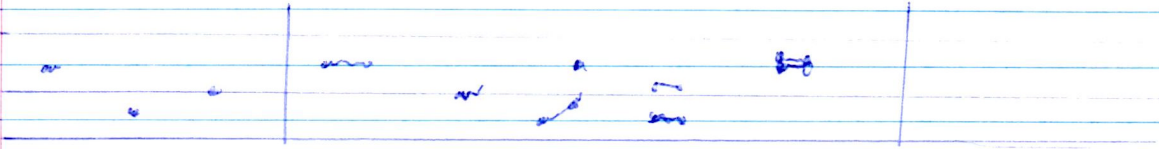
# A Man on a Rock,



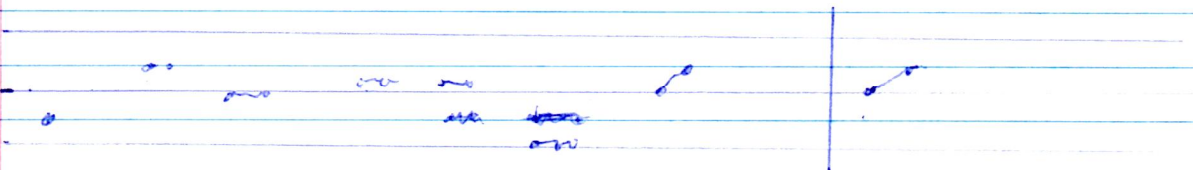
In a time long before our present age, a man was sitting



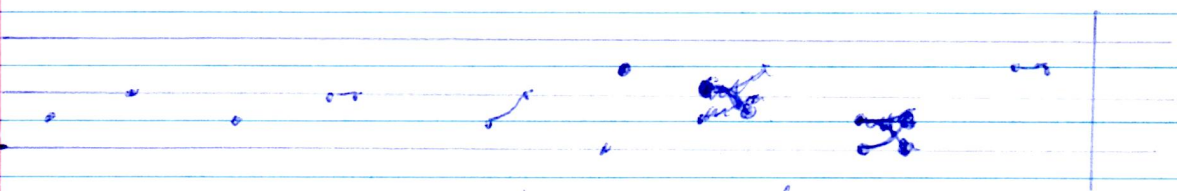
on a rock. In the sunlight by a stream that flow-ed



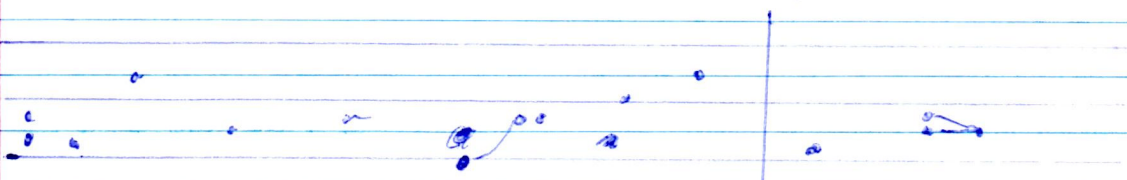
down a hill filling a crystal clear lake.
